Dr. Bronk is presently Chairman of the New York State Science and Technology Foundation and a member of the New York State Public Health Council, both in Albany, New York. Since September, 1969, he has been a member of the Inter-American Committee on Science and Technology, Organization of American States, Washington, D. C. He is currently President of the New York City Hall of Science.

This summary memorandum contains the results of inquiries conducted concerning Dr. Bronk for the period from May, 1961, to the present.

Employment

On July 1, 1953, Dr. Bronk was appointed President of The Rockefeller Institute, New York, New York, and he has continued in that capacity to the present time.

Dr. Bronk serves as trustee of Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland, and The Rockefeller Institute. He is also a member of the National Selective Service Scientific Advisory Group; a consultant to the National Science Foundation and the President's Science Advisory Committee; and a trustee of the American Freedom from Hunger Foundation, Incorporated. Dr. Bronk was a consultant to the Agency for International Development from December, 1961, to May, 1963. He also served as a consultant with the Department of Defense in conjunction with his position as President of the National Academy of Sciences. After three successive four-year terms, Dr. Bronk voluntarily resigned as President of the National Academy of Sciences in 1962.

In 1964 he was the recipient of the Medal of Freedom from President Johnson and the Public Welfare Medal of the National Academy of Sciences. He is a member of numerous scientific organizations in the United States and is a Foreign Associate of the Royal Society of London for the Advancement of Science and the scientific academies of France, Denmark, Sweden, Brazil and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

Marital Status

Dr. Bronk and his wife, Helen, reside in the "President's House" on the campus of The Rockefeller Institute.

Jacob K. Javits, United States Senator from New York, advised at Washington, D. C., that he has known Dr. Bronk as one of the most distinguished scientists in the State of New York.
