

- C. German science has a 25 year lead in rocketry and space craft design, but was not capable of space flight in 1945.
- D. Either some nation, not known to U.S. Intelligence, has developed an advance nuclear propulsion space craft—or the technology currently under study is from another planet or solar system.
- E. Liaison with foreign intelligence channels must continue until this problem is resolved.
- F. Priority given to reported sightings and landings must continue in the national security interest.

IV. DISCUSSION:

A. Nature of Survey.

An analysis has been made of the first one-hundred publications in the AFSA Unidentified Flying Object Intelligence Reports, prepared by the U.S. Army Security Agency, the U.S. Naval Security Group, and the U.S. Air Force Security Service. Additional reports were reviewed which originated from respective branches intelligence departments. These reports were produced in order to establish what material of UFO intelligence is of value in relation to the New Mexico incidents and the ongoing MAJESTIC PROGRAM.

- 1. The AFSA UFO Intelligence Reports, numbered I to 100 (the last dated December, 1950), present significant information on a broad variety of subjects and areas where UFOs were sighted in the air and on the ground (few cases alleged underwater take-offs) since 1946. The published documents consolidate records of derived from the accumulated reports on the interviews, radio and teletype signals, military and civilian radar films, official government communiques, and intelligence agents, here and abroad.
- 2. In this digest, primary attention has been paid to information of technical intelligence interest, particularly in the nuclear weapons and propulsion developments in the Soviet Union.
- 3. For the most part, the sources utlized were not specially trained observers, and the sources may have been subjected to the familiar pitfalls common to all eyewitness and second-hand reports. It must be emphasized that, because the interrogators were not always specialists in the field of paranormal sciences, there is much lack of detail.
- 4. Whenever feasible, detachments of the Army's Interplanetary Phenomenon Unit, were dispatched to sites deemed worthy of investigation and recovering tangible evidence for scientific study.
